OUR PROGRAMS

Our commitment is to provide essential care and screenings for uninsured Hispanic low-income women to detect breast and cervical cancer. We offer assistance such as interpretation services and access to free or affordable examination vouchers.



Within this program, our team hosted **59 in-person educational workshop events** throughout Salt Lake, Davis, Utah, and Tooele County, distributing 1,233 health educational materials.







OUR PROGRAMS TRIUNFADORAS CANCER SUPPORT GROUP

Triunfadoras, a cancer survivor support group for Hispanic women, their families, and caregivers, originated in 2002 with eight patients. Over the years, it has flourished into a community of over 660 survivors. As Utah's only culturally sensitive, Spanish-language cancer support group, Triunfadoras offers ongoing support, fostering resilience and unity.


We teamed up with Image Reborn to send 16 individuals to retreats where cancer survivors can find connection and solace during difficult times.



In 2023, we've experienced an increase in new immigrants seeking asylum applications due to the escalating flow at the U.S.-Mexican border. Recognizing this urgent need, we have continued our unwavering dedication to offering affordable or pro bono immigration services to Utah's immigrant community.

Additionally, in 2023, we launched a new program to cover the costs of citizenship applications.

Clients from México, Peru, Brazil, Colombia, Samoa, India, Italy, Venezuela, Guatemala, Argentina, Ecuador, Chile, Spain, Honduras, El Salvador, Costa Rica and Republica del Congo.

OUR PROGRAMS CHIP AND MEDICAID ENROLLMENT

During the 'Medicaid Unwinding' in 2023, many individuals faced the risk of losing Medicaid coverage due to the transition from auto-renewals to manual renewals. In response, we assisted individuals in updating their information, provided education about the renewal process, and connected them with eligibility workers or employers for verification purposes. Despite some coverage losses, advocacy efforts ensured that ineligible individuals were referred to the marketplace for continued access to healthcare.

Our Chip & Medicaid Assistance program focuses on helping the Hispanic community access free or low-cost medical insurance.

We educate, advocate, and assist clients with the Medicaid application and the eligibility process. Once enrolled, we offer ongoing assistance with renewal and help them understand benefits and obligations.



OUR PROGRAMS COVID COMMUNITY PARTNERS



Our CCP program provides; prevention education, social services navigation, access to free at-home COVID test kits, COVID and flu vaccine community clinics, food banks, rental assistance, mental health services, and more.

Referred 1,679 people to the Diabetes Self Management Education program

Referred 752 people to the Diabetes Prevention Program of these, 10 registered Healthy Living Resources: Our program, in partnership with Kearns Library, The University of Utah, Salt Lake Department of Health, and the National Tongan American Society, connects individuals who are Hispanic or Pacific Islander in Kearns, Utah, to free or affordable resources for the management and prevention of chronic illnesses.



Participated in or held 186 events at which health information was provided to individuals

Together with partners over 100,000 individuals received health information handouts regarding chronic illnesses.


